like / would like



What's the difference?

like = fancy, prefer, to be fond of

Questions are formed using do/does:

Do you like apple juice? Does she like pizza?

 Negations are formed by adding don't/ doesn't:

I don't like apple juice. She doesn't like pizza. would like ('d like) = subconjunctive

 Questions are formed by repositioning "would like":

Would you like to learn English?
Would he like to go to cinema?

•Negations are formed by adding "n´t" to end of "would":

I wouldn't like to learn English. He wouldn't like to go to the cinema.
