PRONOUNS

Personal pronouns:

- I is always capitalised.
- She always points out a female.

BASIC INFO

- They is used for you talk about several people.
- It always points out a thing.
- You can point out three different things.

Object pronouns:

- Her always points out a single female person.
- Him always points out a single male person.
- •Them points out several people.

Possessive pronouns:

- Indicates to whom or to what something belongs.
- Its is only used for nun-human things. E.g: Look at the cow! Its leg is hurt.
- Its is not the same as it's (= it is).
- Don't mistake your for you're (= you are).
- Don't mistake his for he´s (= he is).
